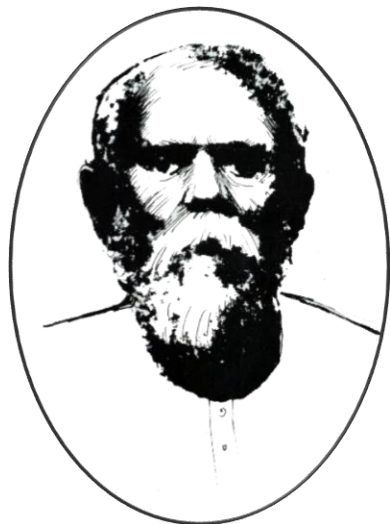

Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram was established on **August 09, 2018**, coinciding with the observance of **Biswa Adivasi Diwas (International Day for the Indigenous Population of the World)**, in the district of Jhargram, West Bengal, India. The University was founded on this significant occasion, which is dedicated to honouring the rich tradition of indigenous communities, particularly the people of the Jungle Mahal region. Primarily, the University was conceptualized and established with the aim of promoting, celebrating and advocating the life, culture and heritage of the people residing in the Jungle Mahal region that includes the indigenous communities as the most significant population groups along with other communities. Apart from this the aim of this university is to extend the opportunities of Higher Learnings and related developments to the remotest corners of the Jhargram District of West Bengal and also the surroundings. Moreover, the University is named in admiration of the renowned Santali poet

Sadhu Ramchand Murmu, whose literary contributions continue to inspire generations.

Spread over **27.02 acres** along the Jhargram–Lodhasuli Road, the University is committed to fostering an inclusive and intellectually vibrant academic environment rooted in the values of nature, culture, and community. It seeks to advance a spirit of collegiality and innovation by integrating indigenous knowledge systems with the transformative advances of modern education. Most significantly the University intends to provide quality higher education and create meaningful opportunities for the youths from both indigenous and other communities from rural Bengal to access modern educational resources and infrastructure.

Prior to the establishment of the University, students from the economically and socially disadvantaged sections of Jhargram and its neighbouring regions had to travel long distances to institutions in Midnapore, Bankura, Purulia, and Kolkata for higher education. Limited availability of seats in these institutions often prevented deserving and aspiring students from pursuing their academic ambitions. Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram was founded to address these challenges by expanding access to quality higher education in this underserved region.

The University presently offers postgraduate programmes in **Bengali, English, Geography, History, History in Santali (Ol Chiki Script), Journalism and Mass Communication, Kudmali, Mathematics, Music and Performing Arts, Nutrition and Public Health, Philosophy in Santali (Ol Chiki Script), Political Science in Santali (Ol Chiki Script), Santali**, and the **Integrated Master Degree of Library and Information Science** for the academic session **2026–2028**. The University also offers **Postgraduate Diploma programmes in Kudmali Language and Culture, and Santali Dance and Music**, along with **Diploma programmes in Santali Dance and Music and Jhumur** for the academic session **2026–2027**.

From this current academic year, the University proposes to introduce several new **Postgraduate Degree, Postgraduate Diploma, Diploma, and Certificate programmes** to further diversify its academic offerings and respond to the evolving educational needs of the society. The University places special emphasis on skill-based, community-oriented education by utilizing the region's unique cultural, ecological, and human resources to promote sustainable and holistic regional development.

In **2026**, the University established the **Centre for Endangered Languages and Culture Research & Training Centre** with the objectives of preserving, revitalizing, and promoting the endangered linguistic and cultural heritage of the region through community participation, academic research, capacity building, and sustainable cultural development. The University has also initiated the establishment of a **Centre for Adivasi Studies and Museum** on its campus to promote research, documentation, preservation, and dissemination of indigenous history, culture, traditions, and knowledge systems.

As the University continues to grow, it remains committed to expanding its academic programmes, strengthening research and innovation, enhancing community engagement, and extending educational opportunities to the people of the region. It wishes to become a centre of excellence that would contribute meaningfully to national development while preserving the rich cultural heritage of its surrounding communities.

Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram firmly believes that dialogue, collaboration, and collective participation are essential for institutional growth and academic excellence. ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram, Jhargram, West Bengal, started its academic activities from the academic session 2021-2022 following THE JHARGRAM UNIVERSITY ACT, 2017 (West Bengal Act XL VIII of 2017) and THE JHARGRAM UNIVERSITY (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2021 (WEST BENGAL ACT VII of 2021) passed by The West Bengal Legislative Assembly. The assent of the Governor was first published in the Kolkata Gazette, Extraordinary, of the January 09, 2018.

Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram, Jhargram is established to function efficiently as a teaching, training and research Centre in various branches of learning and courses of study, including Humanities, Social and Basic Sciences and to promote advancement, dissemination of knowledge, and learning and extending higher education to meet the requirements of higher education and research in the subjects and to serve the society and the nation.

In accordance with the order No. 684-Edn (U) / HED-12016 (58) /2/ 2021-UNV SEC – Dept. of HE Date: 10.07.2021 of the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, the University has begun its journey with four Post-Graduate subjects under Arts and Science Faculties from the academic session 2021-22. The University started its functioning from Jhargram Raj College (Girls' Wing) at Jhargram. The First Vice-Chancellor joined on May 13, 2021.

The University was awarded enlistment under 2(f) of UGC Act, 1956 on July 2021.

The University was shifted to its own Campus at Jitusol in its newly constructed Administrative-cum-academic building on inauguration by the then Hon'ble Chief Minister, Govt. of West Bengal on September 05, 2022.

ONLINE APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The candidates will fill in the specified Application Form only through online portal of university website (www.srcmujhargram.ac.in). They must complete all the steps e.g., personal details, academic details, uploading photo and signature.

The students of all universities in India and abroad are eligible to fill up forms for admission to Post-Graduate Courses and Professional Courses for the academic session 2025-2026.

In accordance with the order No. 638-Edn(U)/HED-12016(21)/5/2025-UNV SEC-Dept. of HE, Dated: 18.05.2026 of the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, the University authority decides to waive the application fee. They have to produce the original Mark Sheets of graduation at the time of verification to be notified later on.

The eligible candidates will pay their prescribed fees online through the official online portal. The link for the payment of admission fees directly from the Admission Portal of the University will be notified in due course.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO POST-GRADUATE AND OTHER COURSES

The candidates passed out in the year **2022, 2023, 2024, 2025 and 2026** are only eligible for admission to Post-Graduate Courses in Bengali, English, History, History in Santali (OL-Chiki Script), Kudmali, Philosophy in Santali (OL-Chiki Script), Political Science in Santali (OL-Chiki Script), Santali, Integrated Master of Library and Information Science, Geography, Mathematics, and Nutrition and Public Health for the academic session 2025-2027.

In case of M.A. in Journalism and Mass Communication, M.A. in Music and Performing Arts, PG Diploma in Kudmali Language and Culture, PG Diploma in Santali Dance and Music, Diploma in Santali Dance and Music and Diploma in Jhumur, there is **no year restriction**.

Who Can Apply:

- The candidates appearing in UG 6th semester (Single Major/ Honours), 2026 (under NEP/CBCS) may apply, provided that they have cleared all semester examinations upto 5th semester with valid eligibility at the time of application.
- The candidates already passed 3 years UG programme under CBCS(Hons) or any other programme having valid eligibility may also apply, provided that they have cleared all the previous semester examinations with valid eligibility at the time of application.
- The applicants, who have completed the qualifying degree, will have to fill in the application form with their SGPA in each semester separately in case of semester system. The applicants who are appearing in the final semester of the qualifying degree or awaiting their final semester results, will have to fill in the application form with their SGPA in each semester separately up to the last semester passed. In case of annual system, the percentage (%) of marks (aggregate of Part-I, II & III) has to be filled up. All the applicants have to produce all the original marksheets, certificates and identity proof at the time of verification.

**THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS HAVE TO BE BROUGHT BY THE PROVISIONALLY
ADMITTED APPLICANTS AT THE TIME OF PHYSICAL VERIFICATION**

1. Printout of the online filled-in Application Form with a passport size coloured photograph affixed in the box provided in the Application Form.
2. Self-attested photocopies of all the Mark sheets of Examinations passed (10th onwards), University Registration Certificate.
3. Self-attested photocopy of the Admit Card/ Certificate of H.S. or equivalent /Madhyamik as evidence of the date of birth.
4. Self-attested photocopy of caste/differently-abled certificate (/s) issued by the appropriate authority, for those applying under respective quota.
5. Self-attested photocopy of EWS certificate (/s) (valid for financial 2024-25 only) issued by the appropriate authority (Govt WB, Ref. No.959-BCW/MR-52/2019, dated: 18.05.2023), for those applying under respective quotas.
6. Migration Certificate (for other university applicants only) must be submitted within two months from the date of admission.
7. Self-attested copy of Aadhar Card.
8. Valid ABC-ID Certificate
9. Downloaded copy of students' and his/her parents/guardian's affidavit regarding anti-ragging from the website (https://www.antiragging.in/affidavit_university_form.php)
10. All the originals of above documents (2 to 9) required to verify.

To be noted:

1. The Application Form, if not properly filled in, is liable to be cancelled.
2. If any correction or editing of data submitted by the candidate is required (in case of any mistake during the submission of the Admission Form), it must be done within the last date of submission of applications in the online portal.
3. All the provisionally admitted candidates are required to produce all the original Marksheets, Certificates and testimonials during verification. Candidates or his/her authorized person is to be present at the time of verification.
4. **If at any stage, it is found that a candidate has concealed, suppressed or distorted any information / fact in the Application Form, his /her admission shall stand cancelled.**

SELECTION PROCESS FOR ADMISSION

1. The selection will be made strictly on the basis of merit.
 - i. For Semester System: Average SGPA x 10, where average SGPA = (Total of all SGPA obtained in the qualifying degree)/ No. of Semesters completed.
 - ii. For Annual System: Aggregate % of Marks (Part-I, II, III) of the qualifying degree
2. If the No. of UG candidate(s) is less than the No. of seats in Integrated Master of Library and Information Science, the seats will be filled up by the PG candidates and vice-versa. Similarly, if the No. of candidates of PG category reserved for SRMUJ is less than the No. of seats, the seats will be filled up by the candidates of other universities and vice-versa.
3. The enlisted candidates in Provisional Merit Lists of M.A. in Music and Performing Arts, Diploma in Santali dance and Music, and Diploma in Jhumur will have to appear at the Interview / Viva-voce for final selection. The candidates selected through the Interview/Viva-Voce shall be eligible for admission to the respective programmes.
4. Online provisional admission will be done through the university admission portal.
5. The verification of testimonials and other documents for provisionally admitted students will be held on the date to be notified by the university authority on university website. The admission of a student will be cancelled, if he /she remains absent from classes for consecutive **ten days from the date of commencement of classes** without any intimation to the university authority.
6. All the provisionally admitted applicants are required to be present on the specified date and to produce all the originals of uploaded Certificates, Mark Sheets and testimonials at the time of physical verification of admission. The final semester marksheet should be produced at the time of Verification. In case an applicant cannot produce the final semester marksheet at the time of verification the applicant's candidature will be liable to be cancelled.
7. Applicants are to follow the notices on the Website of Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram all the time.
8. The student will not indulge in any act of ragging. If he/she is found guilty of any aspect of ragging, he/she will be punished as per provisions of the UGC regulations and/or as per law in force.
9. The admitted students are to attend at least 75% of the total classes held in all Semesters; otherwise, he/she will not be allowed to fill in his/her form for examination.
10. The University authority reserves the right to modify any norms/regulations, etc., at any point of time, and such modifications shall be applicable to all.

ANTI-RAGGING ACTIONS IN SADHU RAMCHAND MURMU UNIVERSITY OF JHARGRAM

Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram has Anti Ragging Committee and Anti Ragging Squad numbers for regulatory measures to curb the menace of Ragging in the University as per the UGC regulations and subsequent amendments available in the UGC website *i.e.* www.ugc.ac.in & www.antiragging.in. University has constituted Anti-ragging Committee as well as Anti-ragging Squad following UGC guidelines.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

Internal Complaints Committee as constituted in the University under the University Grants Commission (Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions) regulations, 2015 and modified guidelines of the year 2023, shall be held responsible to provide recommendations on the basis of their observations on the offence at work place committed and the University authority accordingly will act decisively against all gender based violence, sexual assault / harassment and humiliation and exploitation perpetrated against employees and students of all sexes, especially women employees and students of the third gender on recommendations of the Internal Complaints Committee. The committee is sensitive to the vulnerable groups (socially Compounded by religion, class, caste, sexual orientation, minority identity and by being differently abled) who are particularly prone to harassment.

An aggrieved person is required to submit a written complaint to the ICC within forty-five days from the date of incident. Friends, relatives, colleagues, co-students or any other associate of the victim may file the complaint in situations where the aggrieved person is unable to make the complaint on account of physical mental trauma.

The ICC will enquire about the complaint and submit the report with recommendations, if any, to the University authority and the authority will take decisions as per law.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

A Grievance Redressal Cell, as constituted in the University to meet the resentment of the employees and the students, shall take necessary steps to address the complaints of the employees and the students. An employee or a student may inform his / her complaint to the concerned authority of the University on any academic or administrative matter by submitting an application in a plain paper. He /she will drop the complaint in the 'Drop-box' kept in front of the office of the Registrar. The guardians of the students may also submit their complaints on any academic or administrative matter following the same procedure. This Cell deals with the matter as early as possible and shall take all appropriate measures to resolve it. As per the plan, the Committee will meet once a week and if there is any complaint found in the drop box, the body will inform the concerned authority of the University. The University authority will take action on the recommendation of the Committee. If the Committee is unable to offer suitable unanimous recommendations or the members are not in consensus about the solution, it will be informed to the authority of the University for its solution.

CENTRE FOR ADIVASI STUDIES AND MUSEUM

Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram is established in Jhargram, a socio-economically backward district of West Bengal. According to the Census of 2011, 96.52% of the population of this district lives in rural areas and the rest of the population are in urban areas. 20.11% of the total population belongs to Scheduled Caste (SC) and 29.3% belongs to Scheduled Tribe (ST). The literacy rate of this district is 70.92%.

The academic activities of this University have started from the academic session 2021-22. As the majority of the students are from socio-economically disadvantaged groups mainly from the communities like Santals, Kurmi, Lodha, Sabar, Kherwa, Munda, Ho, *etc.*, there is an utter need to make the students aware of their own cultural heritage and to keep legacy of cultural heritage alive through proper utilization of advanced digital technology.

The Centre plays a key role to motivate the students of all the communities to engage themselves in further research in the concerned fields and to preserve their cultural texts, art and literature. The Centre has to safeguard the endangered folkloric and performative texts of the communities through documentation, preservation and digital archiving. The Centre will regularly organize Workshops / Seminars and Conferences in the concerned fields.

More than 600 sq. ft area has been earmarked in the new campus of the University at Jitusol, where the representative cultural artifacts of the tribal communities like musical instruments, bow and arrow, puppets, smoking instruments, attires and ethnic jewelry, playing instruments, *etc.*, will be collected and preserved. This would help the students, the researchers, and the community members for future engagement.

CENTRE FOR ENDANGERED LANGUAGES AND CULTURE RESEARCH & TRAINING

Sadhu Ramchand Murmu University of Jhargram established the **Centre for Endangered Languages and Culture Research & Training** in 2026. The Centre is dedicated to the preservation, revitalization, and promotion of the endangered languages and cultural traditions of the indigenous communities of Jhargram and the adjoining regions.

Jhargram is home to several indigenous communities, including the **Santal, Lodha, Munda, Bhumij, Mahali, Sabar, Kurmali**, and others. These communities possess a remarkable cultural legacy expressed through their languages, oral literature, folklore, music, dance, rituals, traditional crafts, ecological knowledge, and social institutions. However, rapid socio-economic changes, urbanization, migration, and declining intergenerational transmission have placed many of these languages and cultural practices at risk of extinction. Most indigenous languages remain primarily oral and are inadequately documented, making the preservation of this invaluable heritage an urgent academic and social responsibility.

The Centre serves as a multidisciplinary platform for research, documentation, education, training, and community engagement. The Centre aims to:

- Document, preserve, and revitalize indigenous tribal languages, dialects, oral traditions, and traditional knowledge.
- Promote interdisciplinary research in tribal linguistics, anthropology, ethnology, history, folklore, and performing arts.
- Provide training and skill development in tribal languages, cultural practices, and traditional crafts.
- Develop a comprehensive digital archive of manuscripts, photographs, audio-visual recordings, and cultural artefacts.
- Encourage active participation and leadership of indigenous communities in cultural preservation initiatives.
- Promote tribal arts through exhibitions, festivals, workshops, and cultural exchange programmes.
- Develop culturally relevant educational resources, including dictionaries, grammar books, primers, and storybooks.

Major Activities

The Centre undertakes a wide range of academic and community-oriented activities, including:

- Linguistic surveys and systematic field documentation.
- Documentation of oral histories, folklore, songs, myths, rituals, and indigenous knowledge systems.
- Ethnographic and socio-cultural research.
- Publication of dictionaries, grammar books, research monographs, and documentation reports.
- Language training programmes for tribal youth, teachers, and community researchers.
- Workshops on tribal music, dance, theatre, storytelling, and traditional crafts.
- Certificate courses in Tribal Studies, Linguistics, Cultural Documentation, and Cultural Resource Management.
- Development of a research library, language laboratory, recording studio, tribal museum, and cultural exhibition facilities.
- Organization of annual tribal cultural festivals, outreach programmes, and community engagement initiatives.
- Creation of a digital archive, website, and multimedia resources for wider dissemination of indigenous knowledge.

Vision

The Centre envisions becoming a nationally recognized centre of excellence for indigenous language documentation, cultural research, and community-based heritage preservation. Through academic excellence, collaborative research, and active community participation, it seeks to safeguard endangered languages and cultural traditions for future generations while strengthening the cultural identity, dignity, and sustainable development of indigenous communities.
